

Lettuce



Skill Level-Easy

Flame: 60 days. Distinctly red, slow bolting, looseleaf. Unique variety “a garden rarity”.

Red Romaine: 70 days. Colorful and tasty addition to salads. Red color develops best during cooler weather. Larger romaine at 12” tall and 10-12” wide.

Tennis Ball: 50 days. Small rosettes of light green leaves measure only 7” in diameter and form loose tender heads. Black seeded butterhead.

How to plant:

DIRECT SEED 1" Apart

SEED DEPTH 1/2"

GERMINATION 7-14 Days

THIN: 6-8" Apart

NUMBER OF PLANTS: 10 minimum

Green Thumb Tip

Sow continuously for a constant supply of lettuce. Best grown in cooler weather. Plant in full sun or partial shade.

Harvesting the seed:

There is only a slight chance of cross-pollination between lettuces. As a precaution separate by 25' from other varieties that are going to seed. Allow plants to bolt and form seed stalks. Seed heads may need to be protected from bird damage and rain when drying. Seeds are produced over a 2-3 week period and will require repeated harvesting.



The Waupaca Seed Library is a circulating collection of seeds hosted by the Waupaca Area Public Library.
